## **HISTORICAL CONCH FACTS: DID YOU KNOW?**

Key West High Graduates who became Superintendent of Monroe County:  
Class of 1952 Armando “Bookie” Henriquez, Class of 1982 Michael  
Henriquez, and Class of 1984 Randy Acevedo.

Key West High Graduates who became the Principal of Key West High:  
Glynn Archer Jr., Tommy Roberts, Bobby Menendez, Amber Archer  
Acevedo, Christina Spatch McPherson, & Rebecca Collins Palomino.

Ponce de Leon discovered the **State of Florida** in the **1500’s** for the Spanish  
and claimed it for the **Crown**. He passed by the Keys never stopping but  
called them the “**Los Martires, the Martyrs.**”

In the **1700’s** **Key West** was known as **Cayo Hueso** on all the Spanish maps  
and documents. The reason for this, is that the **Calusa Indians** inhabited the  
Florida Keys in the **1760’s**. A battle happened on the Florida Keys from the  
**Mainland Tribes** and the **Calusa Indians**, as it kept going further south from

island to island the last island they fought on was Key West. The Calusa Indians that were survivors of the war fled to Cuba. The island was full of bones, hence the name **Cayo Hueso**. Around **1822**, the Island became known as **Key West** due to the fact that it was the Key that was the furthest west.

### Ownership of our Island:

**Juan Pablo Salas** was a native of St. Augustine. He was a postmaster in the city. Juan was a “**Soldier of Fortune**” who served the **Royal Artillery Corps**. He was the first person to **gamble** on the real estate of our Island in 1815. Salas wrote up a glowing description of all the many services he performed for the **Crown**, and he requested a suitable reward—namely, the **Island of Cayo Hueso**. He was given the **Island** on **August 26, 1815**. He became increasingly nervous as the **United States** began negotiations with **Spain** for the rights to **Florida**. In **1819** Spain did **Cede Florida** to the **United States** with the provision that recipients of **Spanish land grants** would retain their ownership rights. Salas held onto the Island for six years. He then sold the Island **twice!** The first buyer was **John B. Strong**, a lawyer and ship captain with ties to **wrecking**. The sale date was September 24, **1821** for a cost of **\$5,000.00**. Then on December 20, **1821** he sold the Island again to businessman **John Simonton** for **\$2,000.00** at a **Havana café**. Simonton agreed to sell one undivided quarter of his purchase to **John Warner** and **John Mountain**. They later sold their quarter to **Padron C. Greene**, then a quarter to **John Whitehead** and **John W.C. Fleming** on March 22, **1822**. The **USS Shark** arrived in Key West captained by **Matthew C. Perry** on March 25, **1822**. He hoisted the flag and formally took the Island for the United States. Perry then renamed the Island to **Thompson Island** in honor of the **Secretary of the Navy**. Less than a week later a seven man group landed on the Island and proceeded to claim ownership of the Island for **General John Geddes** of Charleston South Carolina. He bought the Island from **John Strong** on February 11, **1822** for a cost of **\$20,000.00**. Lawsuits were filed, and it was discovered that Strong sold the Island **twice** just like Salas did. Strong’s first sale was to **George Murray**. Crazily no parties got upset and they continued building shelters and working on trade. It took five years and **Congress** finally came to a decision. In a **Special Congressional Act** on May 23<sup>rd</sup>, **1828**, **John Simonton** was recognized as the legitimate owner.

In **1823**, the first Steamship **The U.S.S. SeaGull** was sent to Key West to fight the Pirates of the Caribbean. Commadore **David Porter** commanded the ship.

In **1861**, the **Army** reported that the Armament at Ft. Taylor were 60 Coastal and Garrison Cannons, 50 8-inch Columbians and 10 24-inch Flanking Howitzers.

In **1887**, **Horatio Crain** advocated for women to be appointed on the School Board.

In **1904**, **Walter Thompson** who is the **Great Great Uncle** to **Elizabeth Freeman (Porter Allen Insurance)** class of **1987**. started the newspaper called the **Citizen**. After a few months he sold a portion to his cousin **Thomas Treason Thompson** and his business partner **Macy B. Darnall**. They changed the paper's name to the **Key West Citizen** and kept it as a weekly newspaper. They sold it to Mr. Artman in **1921**. Our Island has had a few newspapers before the **Citizen**, they just didn't survive. Here is the list: **KW Gazette 3-21-1831, Enquirer 10-15-1834, Inquirer Dec. 1835, Light of the Reef 1845, The New Era 1862, The Dispatch 1876, The KW Guardian 1870, The Democrat 1880, The Equator and Spanish Daley 1887, Gulf Pennant 1892, & The Journal 1908.**

In **1867**, the famous author **Mark Twain** came to our island.

**Gary Hernandez**, the Band Director at **KWHS** raised \$300,000.00 dollars to have the band travel to **Rome Italy** for an educational trip and play to the **Rome** crowd on New Years Day aired on Youtube.

In the College Football Play-offs **2025**, The University of Miami had a patch on their jersey remembering our **George Mira—Mira Sr.**

The popular musical group the **Village People** wrote and performed a song call **Key West** in **1979**.

**Danny Margil**, **Class of 2009**, entered the **Dr. Pepper Tuition Giveaway Sweepstakes** that fall while attending **F.A.U.** He was selected to be a contestant during the halftime of the **S.E.C. Championship game**. It was a chance to win **\$100,000.00**. He gave it his best shot at throwing the footballs into a Big Can of Dr. Pepper, unfortunately he lost, but received a **\$23,000.00** check for **2<sup>nd</sup> place**.

**Playboy** was a major sponsor of the **1999 World Offshore Powerboat** races. They sent their **Playmate of the Year Ms. Brooke Richards**. She was on **Wail 99 FM** with our own **Bill Hoebee..he couldn't keep his eyes off her!!!!**

**JP Garcia** and his son **Jesse Garcia** are the only father/son duo to each rush for over **1,000** yards in their careers. **Jp in 89, & Jesse in 2016.**

**Robert James** and his son **Marcus James** are the only father/son duo to pass for **3** touchdowns in a game. **Robert in 71 & Marcus in 97.**

**Bob Rosato** of **NFL Films** is at our high school in **1995** taking pictures for a book by the **NFL** called; **Football in America**. **Key West High** is one of six schools chosen because we are the southernmost high school in the country, and how far we have to travel to play games.

**Charles A. Saul** was a participant in the **punt, pass & kick** competition during the halftime of the **Browns vs Redskins** game **Nov. 12, 1961** on **CBS**.

**Mrs. Carol Cotton**, and her daughter **Pam** have been coordinating the Home Coming court of ladies to learn grace, style and elegance for the past **34** years.

The **Casa Marina** opened for business **Dec. 31<sup>st</sup>, 1921** at a cost of **\$350,000**. A famous guest was **New York Yankee's 1<sup>st</sup> baseman Lou Gehrig**. The **first** car on our island was a **1903 Oldsmobile** owned and driven by **Dr. John B. Maloney**.

The **first powerboat race** was in **1917** won by **Capt. Jack Manson**, he raced from **Miami to Key West**. The boat was a **51 ft. Purdy** with twin **400 hp** engines.

In **1959**, Two **NY Yankees** were in town, **Mickey Mantle**, and **Whitey Ford**, they were taking batting practice at our field.

**Boog Powell** decided he was going to ask **Mantle** for an autograph. **Mantle's answer; Forget it kid!**

The "**Matador**" **George Mira** was on the cover of **Sports Illustrated** in **September 1962**.

**Randy Sterling** was in an article in **Sports Illustrated** on **June 23, 1969**.

It quotes **Joe McDonald** the **Mets** director of minor league operations as saying “Sterling is the most advanced high school prospect in quite a few years.” It also compared him to Mets prospect John Matlack.

**John “Boog” Powell** was on the cover of **Sports Illustrated** on **April 12, 1971**.

**Robert “Speedy” Neal** was in **Faces in the Crowd** of **Sports Illustrated** in **1979**. It was about him being the leading High School rusher in the state of Florida.

**Corey Sawyer** was in the story of **Tainted Title** in **Sports Illustrated** on **May 16, 1994** about how the football players of **FSU** sullied their national championship.

**Kahlil Greene** was in **Sports Illustrated** on **August 25, 2003** in the article **For the Record**. It is about getting the call up to the Major league club the **Padres**.

**Frankie Ratcliff** had a two page spread in **Sports Illustrated** tagging out a Rice Owl runner in a game. He played for the **Houston Cougars** in **2014**.

**Brooks Carey’s** roommate in the minors was **Cal Ripken** the great shortstop of the **Baltimore orioles** and baseball’s **IRONMAN**.

**Conch graduate Alexa Condella, class of 2025** won the **Foot Locker National Scholarship**. It was narrowed down to **40** semi-finalists, and She was one of the **20 Finalist** winners out of **17,000**, applicants. That scholarship was worth **\$20,000**. She then won the **Ken C. Hicks Scholarship** for an additional **\$5,000**. Only **1 of 20** applicants receive this.

**Conch graduate Lt. Caleb “Scarebear” Hiller class of 2014**, is a Navy Fighter Pilot. He did the fly over in his **F18 Super Hornet**, at the **Hall of Fame** football game in **Canton Ohio July 31<sup>st</sup>, 2025**.

**Conch graduate Joseph “Bum” Farto class of 1937**, became the **Fire Chief** in **1964**. He later was arrested and charged with selling **cocaine** to an undercover narcotics agent at the firehouse. Bum was convicted in **February of 1976**. He jumped bail, rented a car and was never seen again. There were sightings that he was in **Central America**, or **California** living the “High Life,” others say he is in the **Miami River**, Some even say he is part of the new **7 mile bridge**. It leads to the question, “**Where is “Bum” Farto?**”

Conch graduates **Tiffany Preston Hughes** class of 94, and **Andrew Cain Freeman** class of 2015. Their **Great and Great Great Grandfather Guy Bradley** was one of the first **FWC Officers**. He was investigating a poaching situation in the Everglades and was killed by the poachers. They named a Key in the Everglades after him. It is called **BRADLEY KEY**.

Conch **Andy Saunders** who owned **Blossoms** on White St. was the owner of the minor league team the **Key West Cubs**.

Actress **Jayne Mansfield** threw out the first pitch at Peter Dopp Field on March 7, 1966. She is the mother of the famous actress **Mariska Hargitay** of the shows **Law and Order** and **SVU**.

**Two-time Superbowl Champion Eli Manning** was in Key West June 2025 with ESPN & NFL Films doing a documentary on **Mike Leach**. He was in the Backyard throwing passes to Conch Football players.

Baseball began in Key West in 1870, its progenitors were **Commander G.W. Thomas** of the Naval Station, **W.S. Hall** manager of the **Western Union Telegraph Co.** and **R. B. Grants** a school teacher. There were 3 teams: **Seminoles**, **Island Cities**, and the **Ocean Stars (boys of 16)**. They used to play on the “**Green**” extending from Elizabeth to Simonton Streets, and from Dey Street to about half of the block between Greene and Front streets. The spectators used to sit on **Logs** along the northern side of Dey Street.

5 Conchs have led their team to a **State Championship**: **Pedro Fraga**, **Ralph Henriquez Jr.**, **Brooks Carey**, **Miguel Menendez**, and **Joey Wardlow**.

**Randy Sterling Sr.** and his granddaughter **Skye Sterling** have each hit a homerun in a varsity baseball/softball game, along with **Sam Holland Sr.** and his grandson **Sammy Holland**, **Ralph Henriquez Jr.** and his son **Ralphie Henriquez III**, **Freddy Varela Jr.** and his son’s **Freddy III**, and **Chris**, plus **Jack Niles** and his daughter **Scarlett**.

There have been **two** families with **three** siblings on a varsity team on the same season, the **Carson’s**: **Jennie**, **Jackie**, and **Jaime** on Soccer, and the **Gage’s**: **Tavyn**, **Maciee**, & **Lilee** on Softball.

McMillan Dr. was named after the **Prime Minister of the United Kingdom Maurice Harold MacMillan** who came and met with **President Kennedy**.

These athletes played 2 or more varsity sports and started on them all four years:

**Kim Heatherington**, for the Volleyball and Softball Teams.

**Jessica Kilgore, MacKenzie Cohen, and Angela Niles** were on the Soccer and Softball Team, **Kathryn Smith** on the Soccer and Lacrosse Team.

The **Fab Four**, the **BEATLES** stayed at the **Key Wester Hotel** on South Roosevelt Blvd. in **1964**.

The following **Presidents of the United States** visited Key West:

**William H. Taft 1912, Calvin Coolidge 1928, Harry S. Truman 1946-57, Dwight Eisenhower 1955, John F. Kennedy 1962, Jimmy Carter 2007, Bill Clinton 1998 at Margaritaville, & Donald Trump 2018.** There were a total of 18 Presidents to visit the Keys.

The others include: **Jefferson Davis, Ulysses S. Grant 1860, Grover Cleveland 1889, Calvin Coolidge 1928, Franklin D. Roosevelt 1939, Herbert Hoover 1920-57, Richard Nixon 1970-74, Gerald Ford, George H. Bush 70's & 80's, and Barack Obama 2014.**

KWHS graduate **Sonia Espinosa** who's family moved to Central Florida, had their property used to film the **Elvis Presley Movie FOLLOW THAT DREAM IN 1962.**

In the early **1830's** Key West was the **richest city** in America. By **1934** it became the **poorest**. By the **1870's** it was the largest city in Florida.

Key West is the same size land wise as the Miami International Airport **4** miles long by **2** miles wide.

**Coach Judd A. Wise's famous saying of "Looking Good, Feeling Good"** is on the door of the of Ladies equipment room for Fast Pitch Softball at Florida State University as one of his former students **Frankie "Big Red" Malgrat** is the equipment manager.

**Deanna Archer Plowman** was Key West High's first homecoming queen in **1951**.

**Kimberlee Edwards** class of **88**, was **Miss Florida Teen USA** in **1987**.

Conch graduate **Natalie Duke**, her family owns Duke Energy.

2<sup>nd</sup> Generation Conch **Bascom Grooms Jr.** has done **two** amazing feats. In **1938**, at the ripe ole age of **16** he received special permission from the **Mayor** and drove a scooter from Key West to Key Biscayne on the Overseas highway before it officially opened. In the late **1940's** he had a friend who was driving a greyhound bus and as he was going over the old 7 mile bridge, **Bascom** did a touch and go on top of the bus in a plane as it was moving.

Key West graduate **Norman Woods** found an area to fish off the **continental shelf** that runs parallel to the Florida Keys, about **20** miles south of Key West. The main fish are dolphin and Marlin, we call this area **Woods Wall**.

Key West's **Richie Garcia**, retired MLB umpire, has a son who is an MLB umpire as well wearing his dad's number **99**.

The Oakland Athletics play their last game at the Oakland Coliseum on Sept. 26, **2024**. When they moved to Oakland from Kansas City over 50 years ago, the very first homerun hit in the Coliseum was by our very own **John "Boog" Powell**.

Mary Immaculate closes it's door for High School in **1986**, and as the students transfer over to KWHS, **Thomas Ackerson Class of 1987** becomes the starting center for the conchs weighing a whopping 185 pounds on a offensive line that had the other four starters at well over 225 pounds.

Born a Conch **Jefferson Browne**, became **President of the Florida Senate** and **Former Chief Justice of the Florida Supreme Court**.

KWHS graduate **Garrett Ullom Class of 2007**, is the Co-Founder/Inventor of the site **LinkedIn**. This was done while he was attending Northwestern Univ.

MIHS graduate **Mark Bollong Class of 1986**, and KWHS graduate **Kevin Cabanas, Class of 1987** were both **High Ranking officers in the Military**. **Kevin** flew MC-130's and was a **Lt. Colonel** and **Mark** a Navy Seal was a **Commander**. They met up in **Iraq, 2010** for a **Joint Special Operations Task Force**.

KWHS graduate **Marc Caputo**, the son of the famous writer **Phil Caputo** & MIHS librarian **Jill Caputo**, is a national reporter for Politico and has been on the national networks CNN & FOX news covering the Presidential campaign and other political views.

In **1995**, **Good Morning America** was in Key West doing their show and Choir teacher **Joe Wilt** had his KWHS Choir on the show.

In **1996**, **Good Morning America** was in Key West doing their show from Rex Weech Field which featured our **Key West High Baseball team**.

KWHS graduate **Richie Garcia Class of 1959**, became a **Major League Umpire** and was the 1<sup>st</sup> base umpire in the movie **FOR LOVE OF THE GAME**, that starred **KEVIN COSTNER**.

KWHS graduate **Patrick Barnett Class of 2018** is a UCF football player and he is a part of EA Sports College Football **2025** Video Game.

TJ Moore Jr. born a **Conch** is a football player at Clemson Univ. and is the son of KWHS graduate **Terrance Moore Class of 2005**, TJ is a part of EA Sports College Football **2025** Video Game.

KWHS graduate **Angie Smith Class of 1993**, has a son **Tobias Myers** who is a pitcher in the Major leagues with the **Milwaukee Brewers**.

KWHS graduate **Danny Galvan** is the All-time strike out and wins leader for the Keiser Univ. Baseball team.

KWHS graduates **Jonathan Gates** and **Jennifer Freeman's** son **JP Gates**, led the Univ. of Tampa to its **9th National Championship** in Division 2, by hitting a homerun, pitching the last three innings and was named the Tournament MVP.

KWHS graduate **Steven Wells Jr. Class of 2014** breaks the FSU consecutive hits mark by going **12-12** with **3** Homeruns in April **2018**. He is the National Collegiate Baseball Player of the Week. Steven also hit a game winning homerun that not only won the game but made Coach Mike Martin of FSU the all-time wins leader in **D1 Baseball**.

KWHS **Khalil Greene Class of 1998** won the **Golden Spikes** award, and the **Dick Howser Trophy** in **2002**. He also is the NCAA Division 1 leader for

baseball with the most doubles in a career with **95** and is one of three players to have **400 + hits** in a career in all the 3 Divisions of the NCAA.

The **Arnold family** with their children **Ricky, Shane** and **Dara** all KWHS graduates, own Arnolds Towing. They had a show on the Discovery Channel called **Shipwreck men**.

The **Arnold family** along with the **Viera family** whose granddaughter is **Maria Viera Davila** has a famous Naval Capt. Who was on the **Battleship Maine** when it went down in **Havana Cuba**. His name is **Capt. Phillip Cosgrove Sr.**

He is a **5<sup>th</sup> Generation Grandfather** to the **Arnolds** and is **Maria's Great Great Uncle**. He went back to **Havana Cuba** to retrieve the **American Flag** from the **Battleship Maine** and brought it back to **Key West**. You can see bits and pieces of it at the **East Martello Towers. Cosgrove Light** is named after **Capt. Phillip Sr.**, and the Cosgrove home is on **Whitehead Street** right next door to the **Banyon House** where you can see his plaque.

Key West had **two** minor league teams. The **Key West Padres** (San Diego) **1969**, and the **Key West Cubs** (Chicago) **1975**. On the **75**, team was **Hall of Famer Bruce Sutter**, and the manager was the great Red Sox skipper **Don Zimmer**.

**Class of 1946 Graduate Sonny McCoy**\_water skied to Havana Cuba from Key West on June 22, **1978**. It took 6 hours 10 minutes. He was the **Mayor** of Key West, then became the **Mayor** of Monroe County.

**Class of 1954 Gilbert "Gibby" Gates**\_Became the **Fire Chief** in **1975**. He was on the **1953 & 1954** State Championship baseball teams. His son **Jonathan Gates Class of 1996** was on the **1995 & 1996** State baseball Championship teams.

**Class of 1963 Graduate Dennis Wardlow** of **Mary Immaculate High School** Became the **Mayor** of Key West in **1981**.

**Class of 1968 Graduate Richard "Dickie" Wardlow** Became the **Fire Chief** in **1995**.

**Class of 1973 Graduate Billy Wardlow Sr.**\_Became the **Fire Chief** in **2000**.

**Class of 1962 Graduate Tim "Buddha" Fahey** Became **Fire Chief** in **1998**.

**Class of 1964 Graduate Hugh Morgan** was a U.S. Magistrate Judge in Key West since 1981.

**Class of 1954 Graduate Glynn Archer Jr.** Became the Key West Citizen Sports Editor, Principal of KWHS, and Assistant Superintendent. His Daughter **Amber Archer Acevedo Class of 1980** became the Key West Citizen Sports Editor, Principal of KWHS, and Deputy Superintendent.

**Class of 1974 Graduate Robert James** taught at KWHS for 35 years, was the Head Basketball, and Football Coach. Freshwater Conch Gloria James his wife taught at Poinciana Elementary School for 38 years was the Head Fast Pitch Coach. Their daughter **Ashley James Class of 2004**, briefly taught at Poinciana Elementary School and became the Head Fast Pitch Coach.

**Class of 1969 Graduate Bill Butler** taught History at HOB and KWHS for 35 years and was the Head Basketball Coach. His son **Dexter Class of 2004** taught History at HOB and was the Head Basketball Coach.

**Class of 1997 Graduate Gary Hernandez** the Band Director raised over \$250,000.00 dollars to take the KWHS Band to London to play in the New Years Day Parade on which aired on the PBS channel January 1, 2024.

Born a **Conch May 3<sup>rd</sup> 1890** Alejandro “Alex” Pompez was known as a Afro-Cuban-American. He was an owner of the New York Cubans baseball team. In 1947 they won the Negro League World Series in the Negro Leagues last season. Pompez was an International Scout for the New York and San Francisco Giants for 26 years. The careers he touched were Orlando Cepeda, Martin Dihigo, Monte Irvin, Willie McCovey, Juan Marachal, the Alou brothers, Jose, Felipe, and Manny, along with Luis Tiant, and Willie Mays. His career spanned from 1916-1950. In the Negro League he was a manager, officer, owner, and Vice-President, He along with 16 other players from the Negro League were inducted into **Cooperstown**, the **Baseball Hall of Fame on February 27, 2006**. He passed away March 14, 1974.

**A 1956 graduate from Douglas High School, Conch James “Rocky” Portier played baseball for the Key West Eagles an Independent Negro league, then auditioned for the Indianapolis Clowns at age 16 in the Negro League. After graduation, he signed with the Brooklyn Dodgers. Rocky went back to the Clowns after one season. He is in the Negro Baseball Hall of Fame and Major League Baseball Hall of Fame.**

**Born a Conch June 5, 1891, Irvin Woodberry “Chester” Brooks was a pitcher and 2<sup>nd</sup> baseman for the Brooklyn Royal Giants of the Negro League in 1918. He passed Feb. 4, 1966.**

**Born a Conch Dec. 14, 1914, Tice Livingston “Winky” James was a shortstop from 1936-1946 for the Chicago American Giants, and the Indianapolis Clowns of the Negro League. He passed March 13, 1989.**

**Born a Conch Aug. 28, 1873, Jose Agustin “Tinti” Molina Becerra was a catcher, 1<sup>st</sup> baseman and manager in the Cuban and Negro Leagues. He was elected to the Cuban Baseball Hall of Fame. He passed Jan. 10, 1961.**

**Born a Conch Nov. 28, 1911, Eugene L. Smith was an infielder in the Negro League from 1941-1946 for the Jacksonville Red Caps, Cleveland Buckeyes, and the Indianapolis Clowns. He passed Oct. 3, 1995.**

**Born a Conch May Aug. 8, 1903, Nathaniel Elmer Trammall, was a 1<sup>st</sup> baseman one season in the Negro League for the Birmingham Barons. He is famous for being the Editor of Colored Baseball & Sports Monthly. In 1934 he wrote an article on “Will colored players enter the Major leagues.” An early plea advocating for the abolishment of baseball’s “Color Line.” He passed in March 1973.**

**Mr. Jim Carter Choir Teacher at Key West High had his choir group sing with the rock band Foreigner at the Coffee Butler Amphitheatre on March 12, 2024, it was part of their farewell tour.**

**Mike Stack class of 2008 writes the song I’m from Key West and sings it with Daryl Lewis Class of 2005. It becomes the city’s National Anthem!**

***John M. Spottswood Sr. Class of 1938* is elected Sheriff of Monroe County in 1952. Then he gets elected to the Florida Senate in 1963. He brought the very first radio station to Key West in 1945 with the help of President Harry S. Truman, the dream became a reality. Radio Station WKWf 1600 AM**

began to air in Key West. President Truman helped Mr. Spottswood get the station as he wanted to hear his daughter sing at the New York Metropolitan Opera House while he vacationed at the Little White House in Key West.

**Ron Saunders CLASS OF 1972**, is elected as the State Representative for the Florida Keys in **1986**, and then elected again **2006**. He spent **14** years in the Florida house of Representatives.

*Charles Walker becomes the first black athlete at Key West High in 1964-65, as segregation comes to an end and Douglas High School merges with KWHS.*

John “Boog” Powell Class of **1959**, was a famous character on the Miller Lite commercials: “Taste Great, Less Filling.”

Class of **1954**, Vincent Catala becomes Chief of Police in **1978**.

Bill Butler Class of **1969** won a State Championship in basketball in **1968**, his son Devon won a State Championship in baseball in **1998**.

Bill Spottswood Sr. Class of **1971** won a State Championship in baseball in **1969**. and was on the Conchs Basketball team as they were the State Runner up in **1970**. His son Billy Jr. won the State baseball Championship in **1998**, and son Chaz did the same in **2005**.

Randy Sterling Sr. Class of **1969** won a State Championship in baseball in **1969**, his son Randy Sterling Jr. won a State Championship in baseball in **1995**.

Conchs Todd Swofford Class of **1981** Mary Immaculate, and Rick Lopez Class of **1985** KWHS come up with the idea to have a local sports talk radio show on WKWF 1600 Am. It begins in the fall of **2001**, at Chili's. Conch Town Live is born, and has been a success ever since.

A **1993** graduate, Captain Steve Rodger son of KWHS Math Teacher Al Rodger has a fishing show called **Into the Blue** that was on Discovery Channel, Bally Sports and The Outdoor Channel and is still going on.

A **1993** graduate, Captain Rush Maltz has a fishing show called **Local Knowledge** that was on the Discovery Channel and now airs on You Tube Tv.

**Tony “Crush” Acosta Class of 1996, was a foot model for Home Shopping Network 2002.**

**Conch Rick Lopez the “Voice” of the Conchs, and General Manager of Florida Keys Media, Class of 1985 wins the Marconi Award presented to the best small market radio station in the USA.**

**The Swoffords Gayle “Swiftly” Swofford, and sons Todd and Timothy Lee were owners of the radio station WKIZ 1500 am. Swiftly also owned the first FM station what is now WEOW 92.7.**

**Paul Wachter whose two children are KWHS graduates was on the series Survivor **The Millennials vs the Gen X**. Paul represented team Gen X He was eliminated in episode 6.**

**Born a Conch in 1902, Lincoln Theodore Monroe Andrew Perry whose stage name was “Stepin Fetchit” became the First Black Actor and First Black millionaire in 1933. He appeared in 44 films on screen or TV, he has a star on the HOLLYWOOD WALK OF FAME. After his passing in 1976, two years later he was inducted into the BLACK FILMMAKERS HALL OF FAME.**

**Douglas High School graduate, Class of 1941, Theodore “Fats” Navarro became a famous Jazz musician playing all over the world. He is the Uncle to Conch Alumnus Coach Robert James.**

**Born a Conch, Bronson Arroyo moved to Tampa and had a solid Major League Baseball career for 16 seasons as a pitcher.**

**Born a Conch, on August 6, 1965 to a military family stationed in Key West. NBA Superstar David “The Admiral” Robinson played 15 seasons in the NBA for the San Antonio Spurs.**

**Born a Conch, on March 22. 1979, Anthony (Tony) Dewayne White II was an Associate Head Coach and Defensive Coordinator for the Nebraska Cornhuskers. and now is the Defensive Coordinator for FSU.**

**Born a Conch, on January 2, 1955, Ed Beckman played 8 seasons in the NFL for the Kansas City Chiefs.**

Born a Conch, in February 11, 1967 John Allen Patterson played 3 seasons in Major League Baseball for the San Francisco Giants.

Born a Conch, on February 20, 1972, Shane Spencer played 7 seasons in Major League Baseball for the New York Yankees, Texas Rangers, Cleveland Indians, & the New York Mets.
