RADIO HISTORY:

With fans packing to capacity the **2,000** seat Key West High school gym to watch their Conch basketball team beat rivals in the Greater Miami Athletic Conference in **1968**, local radio pioneer **Gayle "Swifty" Swofford** began to cover the squad. This culminated in a live broadcast on **WKIZ 1500 AM** of the Conchs State Championship victory **45-39** over Orlando Evans. **"Swifty" Swofford** expanded his coverage of Key West Basketball in **1969** to cover all away games. WKIZ would go on to broadcast Key West Basketball **"on the road"** with the Conchs during **Coach Dave Fedor's** remaining tenure through 1978. **Todd Swofford** picked up the broadcast for the **2002 State Championship** Game that featured Coach Bill Butlers Conchs vs Nease on the Spottswood's station **WKWF 1600 AM**. **Rick Lopez**, and **"The Coach" Judd A. Wise** broadcasted games in the **2012** season, and hopefully the future will bring more broadcasts for our fans.

HISTORY:

Teens & 20's:

Basketball began in **1913**, the first Key West team was at the **Hargrove Institute**. Then in the **1920's** the Monroe County Conchs were the team. The Key West Conchs ***began in 1927 with **Milland Anderson** as their very first coach.*** There were **no classifications** in **1926-27**. *This is what I found for the 1927 team, as they went 7-5.*

Players from the 27 cagers: Fred Carbonell, Robert Knight, Earl Yates, Ernesto Hernandez, Fred Matthews, Theron Gato, Floyd Ayala, Oliver Armayor, Isadore Weintruab, Glynn Archer, Joe Varelo,

Harry Capo, Earl Jackson, Maurice Cruz, Floyd Roberts, Reggie Trevor, and Kermit Baker. The very **first** game was against Homestead High, and the Conchs **lost** 29-28, their very **first** victory came against Redland High 21-20. The Key West Conchs, made the State Play-offs, but **lost** to Tate 30-18. *This group of cagers finished 2nd in the Intersectional Tournament in Lakeland, Florida.* The **28** season, began with **Coach Anderson** but he only coached one game and resigned, the **Pastor Coach Butman** took over. *In the 29 season, Coach Butman's squad played the University of Havana from Cuba.*

30's & 40's:

We are missing 5 seasons of records in the 40's and stats are not there. We have 4 names from the cagers who played for Key West High in 1933. Bill Cates, Ygnacio Carbonell, Joe Navarro, & Ralph Amable.

In 42, Kingsport Tenn. Came to Key West to play a two-game series.

Harold Haskins of the **44** cagers is the first Conch to play major college basketball. He played for the **Florida Gators**. He would later come back to coach the Conchs.

Key West is **the most** giving community, proved it in the forties, as teams who traveled down here were given homes to stay in, dinners and dances to raise money to help with their expenses.

In **1946**, Key West wins their **first District Championship** under **Coach Huddleston**, the Conchs made the State-Playoffs, but lost to Frostproof **48-37** in **Class C**.

The 49 season saw Key West play three college teams, Palm Beach Jr. College, St. Leo, and the Freshman team from the Univ. of Miami.

1950's:

1951 there was a **passenger/ferry** from **Cuba** to Key West. **Havana's** Belen High School took the ferry to play the Conchs. Key West **wins 75-62**, and the interesting fact is that the Belen School shuts down by a famous Alumni of theirs **Fidel Castro**. Belen leaves Cuba and moves to Miami and becomes Belen Jesuit High School. The Conchs **First Championship** came in **1955** in the **Gold Coast Conference** beating North Miami. Key West plays Coral Shores for the first time and wins handily 64-28, in the matchup of Keys schools.

1960's:

Ron Harris was the **first** Key's basketball player to be named to the **First Team All-State**. He scored **44** points vs Miami Southwest in **1967**. He signs with **FSU** to play basketball.

Basketball was the **KING** of sports at Key West High in the **60's & 70's**. If you did not get to the **Jv** game, there was a good chance you didn't get a seat! The football players held a rope that went around the court to keep the fans off the court as they were shoulder to shoulder! **Coach Dave Fedor** was **Florida's coach of the year in 1968**. **Key West ended up ranked No. 1 in the State in 68, preseason No. 1 in 69.**

1970's:

Bill Butler was named the **TOP PLAYER IN FLORIDA HIGH SCHOOL BASKETBALL IN 1970**. He signs and plays for **Coach Denny Crumm** at the **University of Louisville**. Key West traveled to the **Bahamas** in **1969-70** to play the **Aquinas of Nassau** in an old converted airplane hanger.

Tyrone Washington & Denny Clark are named to the **Dade-Monroe County All-Star Team**.

Denny Clark is a **MacDonalds All-American** and makes the **All-South Team**.

Out of 480 players, **Tyrone Washington** is picked to participate in the **B/C All-Star Camp in Milledgeville Ga.**

1980's:

1980 Tyrone Washington is a **MacDonalds All-American** and signs with **Rice Univ.** to play basketball.

1983 Conch Great **James Howard** tips off to start the game against St. Thomas Aquinas, his opponent, SuperBowl Champion, & Hall of Famer from the Dallas Cowboys, **Michael Irvin**. In **1984**, the conchs were on TCI Sports tv vs American with our own **Glynn Archer Jr.** With the Play by Play.

Eric Bethea signs with **UCF** to play basketball.

Coach Marty Arnold's conchs play in two prestigious basketball tournaments in **1985**, the **College Town Classic at the University of Florida**, and the **Bahamas Christmas Tournament**. They are **1 of the 3 teams from the U.S.**

In the same season **Coach Arnold's** team beats **No. 1** Carol City, **No. 2** Miami High, **No. 3** Miami Central and **No. 5** Miami Edison. In what **Denzel Leggett** called our home court "The Conch Spectrum." What we call today The "CONCH DOME"! **Mike Dean** signs with **St. Thomas Univ.** to play basketball.

1990's: Coach Judd A. Wise started the **Coopers Paint and Body Christmas Tournament** in **1990**. Key West loses to St. Thomas Aquinas in the **Regional Championship** on a last second 35 foot three pointer. **Leron Graves** breaks the record for most points in a game with **46** that night. He signs with **Hawaii Pacific** to play basketball. **Leron** receives recognition being selected to be on the **Florida Sportswriters All-State Team**. **Coach Wise** has back to back **20 loss seasons**.

2000's:

Bill Butler played for the Conchs and was on the **State Title** team of **68**, he returned to Key West to become a teacher and then came back to be the Head Coach of the Conchs and took his team he coached to the **State Title** game in **2002**. Coach Butler's squad was ranked **No. 1** going into the **State Championship** game in **2002**.

Kieth Valdez of the **2009** squad sets the **State Record** for Consecutive Free Throws made with **44**.

Coach Antoine Lopez had the only undefeated regular season in **2012, (13-0)**.

Coach Bill Butler's son **Dexter** follows in his father's footsteps and becomes the Coach in **2023**. He passes away unexpectedly in the spring of **2024**, and his cousin **Thomas Butler** is named the Head Coach.

James Osborne Jr. ties a 35 year record by scoring **46** points against Westminster Christian to tie for the most points scored in a game.

In 1950-51, basketball restarted at Douglas High. Members of the 53 squad were: Alfred Saunders, Hilton Williams, Kenneth Carey, Anthony Sawyer, Charles Clarke, Jimmie Hines, Leo Rivas, and James "Rocky" Poitier

In 64, they were the SouthEastern Atlantic Conference Champions.
